

SESSION DESCRIPTIONS DAY 1 NOVEMBER 4, 2025 CREDENTIALING 101 TIFFANY LONG, BA, CPMSM, CPCS, FMSP



Objectives:

- Define Core Credentialing Concepts: Participants will be able to explain fundamental credentialing terms and processes, including primary source verification, privileging, and accreditation standards.
- Outline the Credentialing Workflow: Participants will understand the key steps in the credentialing lifecycle, from application submission and verification through approval and ongoing monitoring.
- Recognize the Importance of Compliance and Accuracy: Participants will identify the impact of accurate credentialing on patient safety, regulatory compliance, and organizational efficiency, while learning how to avoid common errors in the credentialing process

Having an organized, detailed and consistent process for the vetting of healthcare practitioners is vital to any organization's success. This introductory session provides a comprehensive overview of the essential concepts and processes involved in healthcare credentialing. Designed for professionals new to the field or those seeking a refresher on the foundations of credentialing. Objectives:

- Understand where and how peer review takes place in a range of medical settings

In order to weather today's uncertain economy and the increased scrutiny they face, hospitals must consistently measure, monitor, and compare practitioner performance, while fully complying with accreditation standards. Self-assessment of its peer review program allows the hospital to identify the strengths and weaknesses in its existing framework and to implement changes as needed in order to ensure that their practitioners are providing the highest standard of care.

IMPLEMENTING EFFECTIVE PROCESSES TO MEET AAAHC STANDARDS NYLEEN FLORES

Objectives:

- How to obtain/maintain a survey readiness, effective processes for accreditation
- Highlight key areas essential to a quality program in an ambulatory surgical center
- Outline AAAHC standards related to credentialing and privileging for an ambulatory surgery center vs a hospital

Summary:

Accreditation readiness isn't a one-time event - it's a culture. This session will equip medical staff professionals, ASC administrators, and credentialing teams with practical strategies to maintain continuous compliance with AAAHC standards.

Through real-world examples and expert insight, we'll explore the nuts and bolts of credentialing & privileging in the ambulatory surgery center (ASC) setting, from initial verification to recredentialing, peer review, and quality improvement integration. Attendees will learn how to navigate the unique challenges ASCs face compared to hospitals, avoid top-cited deficiencies, and build a sustainable framework for patient safety and quality care. Whether you're preparing for your first survey or fine-tuning a seasoned program, this session will provide actionable steps to achieve and maintain ASC excellence.



SESSION DESCRIPTIONS DAY 2 NOVEMBER 5, 2025 MULTI-STATE LICENSING 101 TIFFANY LONG, BA, CPMSM, CPCS, FMSP



Objectives

- Explain Core Licensing Concepts and Pathways: Participants will be able to differentiate between the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact (IMLC) and the Federation Credentials Verification Service (FCVS), as well as understand the distinctions between endorsement and examination-based licensing applications.
- Navigate Continuing Medical Education (CME) Requirements: Participants will gain the ability to identify key CME requirements for license renewal across multiple states and understand how to avoid common pitfalls that could lead to compliance issues or licensing delays.
- Implement Best Practices for Multi-State Credentialing: Participants will learn strategies for managing multi-state licensing complexities, including tips for avoiding common application errors and preparing for licensing audits effectively.

Summary:

With the exponential growth of telemedicine MSPs are finding that they need to add an extensive understanding of multi-state licensing to their credentialing "toolbox". Keeping up to date with the complexities of each state's requirements can be overwhelming. This session will provide a fundamental knowledge of licensing core concepts.
